#### Peculiar gait

The other main characteristic I consider is the peculiar Springer gait, which I actually hate and after quite a short time in showing I mastered two ways to stop them doing it in the ring. It is of course a natural gait, both legs being moved simultaneously at each I side, causing a roll peculiar to Springers, which is so ugly and ungainly, as opposed to one moving correctly straight in front and the hind legs driving under the hips. When doing that they flow along and it's a joy to see. It takes a lot of practice to make them move freely on a lead with the correct gait. Give them freedom in a field and at first they run about just for the sheer joy of life but soon down comes the nose and, depending on how strong the working instinct is in them, and the age they are, you can after a while see quite clearly the hunting instinct which is their heritage.

I think they have changed quite a lot over the years in size and conformation, but if you really look as I did at Bournemouth, and I had plenty to look at, I think it's the breed type that has changed—the Springer itself is much the same.
